


Early College Access Program



- www.aacps.org/ecap
- *Eligibility/College and Career Readiness*
 - In general, 3.0 cumulative GPA and successfully completed MCAP (determined in July of 2026),
 - If you are College and Career Ready (CCR) you can take up to 4 classes at AACC classes in 11th and 12th grade
 - 10th graders with GT status may qualify for classes as well
- *10th and 11th graders* may take AACC courses after school hours/weekend
- *Next Steps*
 - Speak with your School Counselor during course registration
 - Attend an information session with the AACC advisor

As RISING JUNIORS, you are eligible to register for AACC Restoration Ecology and AACC Intro to Drone Technology

- AACC Professors come to Broadneck to teach these classes during 3rd or 4th block during semester 2
- Students must take both courses, and sign up for them during regular BHS scheduling in February
- Classes are AP weighted in Broadneck GPA and count as BHS elective credits
- Successful completion results in 7 college credits from AACC
- Credits and course materials are no cost to students through ECAP
- Students do not have to be Signature students to take these classes.


