Scheduling Timeline

- Jan. 27: Student Portal opens
- Jan. 27-Feb. 1: Input course requests for next year
- Feb. 2-Mar. 11 : Counselors meet with STUDENTS during English classes.
 **No need to make an appointment with counselor!
 - 9th grade Feb. 2 – 13
 - 10th grade Feb. 17 – 27
 - 11th grade Mar. 2 - 11
- March 11: Course Verification will be available in PowerSchool,
last chance to request changes.

No course change requests after March 11!

New Guidance for senior year scheduling

Seniors who are on track to meet all graduation requirements may request a reduced schedule during the scheduling process. Seniors must remain enrolled in **2.0 credits or more per semester** including the required Math and English courses.

Examples Include:

- 2 dual credit courses at AACC
- 2 elective courses in area of interest
- Work-based internship (earn 1 credit each semester)

College and Career Readiness (CCR)

What are the benefits?

- AACPS will pay for all of students' AP exam fees if enrolled in the course

Four Steps to Graduation

 - 4 Take **State-mandated Assessments** in *Algebra, English, Government, Science*
