- Research Colleges




RESEARCH: WHERE SHOULD JAPPLY?





ADMISSIONS TYPES

Early Action	Regular Decision	Rolling Admission
Apply early and receive a decision well in advance of regular response date; AKA "Priority Deadline"	Submit application by specified date and receive decision in clearly stated period of time	Review applications as they are submitted

Students make a commitment to a firstchoice school where if admitted they definitely will enroll. Early Deadlines.

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTS

SAT/ACT

- X
- College entrance exams all colleges accept both
- ACT has a science section on it
- It is not recommended to take more than 3 times
- Must register for tests at collegeboard.org or act.org
- Multiple testing opportunities in the summer and early fall

TEST OPTIONAL

X

- Check college websites to see if college is Test Optional
- Review freshman profile to see average SAT/ACT score
- Do not send if you score does not fall within the average


Select Academic Statistics for Admitted Students:

Average weighted GPA: 3.81

Middle-50% SAT score range: 1170-1320

Middle-50% ACT composite score range: 24-30

STUDENT ATHELETES: NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER

- Register with NCAA: If you plan to play at a D1 or D2, you MUST register with the NCAA Clearinghouse. There is a \$75 fee to complete your NCAA account.
- Request your transcript: Once your NCAA account is complete, you need to contact Ms. Sudo and request a transcript be uploaded to your portal.
- You can register now for the NCAA
- A verbal commitment with a coach does
 NOT mean you have been accepted to that particular school.
- Talk to high school coach or AD about recruiting opportunities and process

(click on college, "Recommenders & FERPA")
Complete your "Senior Survey for Counselor Letter of Recommendation" - in Naviance
Start your college essay and sign up for any necessary SAT/ACT exams
Organize what each college requires/deadlines
You can use the College Research Worksheet
Sign up and attend summer workshops for essay and Common App help
