Plan for Senior Year

- Determine what courses are needed for graduation
 - College (2 of the same world language credits and at least Algebra 2)
 - <u>Career</u> (CAT-South, Early Childhood, Career Transitions, NJROTC, Business Management, Natural Resources and Conservation (Environmental Literacy Signature Program)
 - <u>Dual</u> (both College and Career)
- Schedule courses that prepare for post-high school goals
 - Four-year colleges look for a continued rigorous course schedule
 - Take a rigorous class senior year in an area of interest
 - AP class to earn college credit
 - AACC ECAP classes beyond what Broadneck offers
 - Credits transfer to Maryland universities and some other colleges
- Partial Schedule (English 12 and Math minimum)
 - ECAP college courses at AACC
 - Work
 - Internships
 - Apprenticeships

Plan for after high school

- Four-Year College or University
 - Competitive application process
- Two-Year Community College (AACC)
 - Transfer to four-year university
 - Earn Associate's degree or job certification
 - AACC presentation on December 17
- Military
 - Visit BHS Counseling Website for recruiting information
 - Take the ASVAB placement test on March 16
- Career/Technical School
 - Visit "Career Resources" section of BHS Counseling Website
 - AACC's new Clauson Center for pre-apprenticeship preparation

- Dual Credit: AACC courses earn High School credit

- Activities and Service (leadership is key)
- Test Scores (SAT/ACT) (not always required)
- Essays
- Recommendation letters (Teacher/Counselor)
- Interviews (competitive universities)

Only used for Special Consideration


- Athletics

- Geography




In-School PSAT and SAT Testing

In-school SAT administration for 11th grade will be Wednesday, April 15 (FREE!, no registration required). It's digital again this year on your Chromebooks







SAT vs ACT

- Separate college admissions tests; colleges will accept scores from either test.
- Most colleges will "super-score" your test results
- Some colleges are <u>test-optional</u>, more are starting to require scores
 - Check college admissions offices' websites for their policy.
- This info will be discussed in more detail at 4-year college kick-off session in June


Let's Get Started on Naviance

- Open your Chromebook to view ClassLink apps
- Click on the Naviance ID BNH app in ClassLink
- You may be asked for school name.
- Click on the Student icon

 - Research Graduation Rate, Net Average Cost, Acceptance Rate, Scattergrams, Top Majors
 - Add/Favorite Colleges that interest you so you have a good list of "Colleges I'm Thinking About" to research further
 - Lookup a college you're interested in and few their website for specific details about the college's application deadlines and requirements (search the college, then "undergraduate admissions")
 - o Compare colleges on your list to each other
 - What's a goal for you to earn on the SAT based on your college interest list?
 - You will take the SAT test on Wednesday, April 15 at Broadneck. No need to register. Review the <u>CollegeBoard</u> <u>Junior Planning Checklist</u>.
- Want to take a course for college credit at AACC next year? Sign up for the AACC presentation on December 17 at 9:00 AM (1st block) in Naviance in Colleges>College Visits

- Discuss post-secondary options and financial aid with your parents/guardians
- Continue to explore career options; use Naviance tools and Grade 11 Lesson on BHS website
- Discuss senior schedule options with teachers and parents to prep for meeting with counselor in March
