- Test Scores (SAT/ACT) (not always required)
- Essays
- Recommendation letters
- Leadership
- Interviews



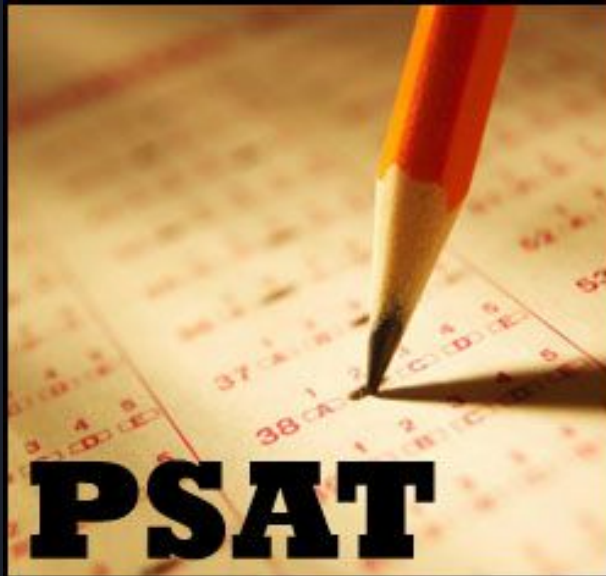
Only for Special Consideration

In-school SAT administration for 11th grade will be Wednesday, April 17 (FREE!). It's digital this year on your Chromebooks



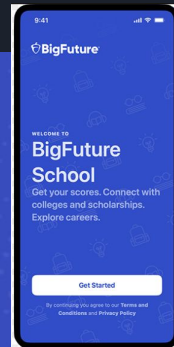


SAT and ACT

- This info will be discussed in more detail at 4 year college info sessions in December and January



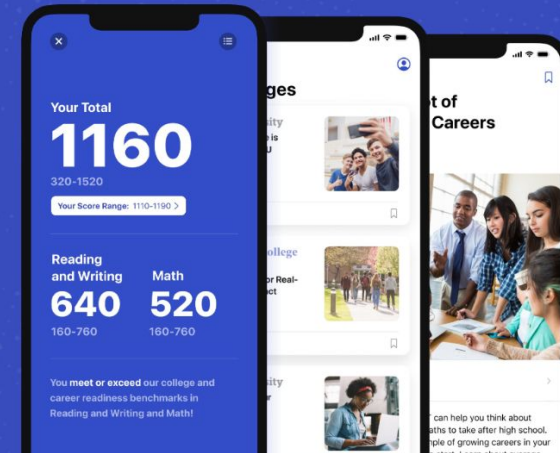
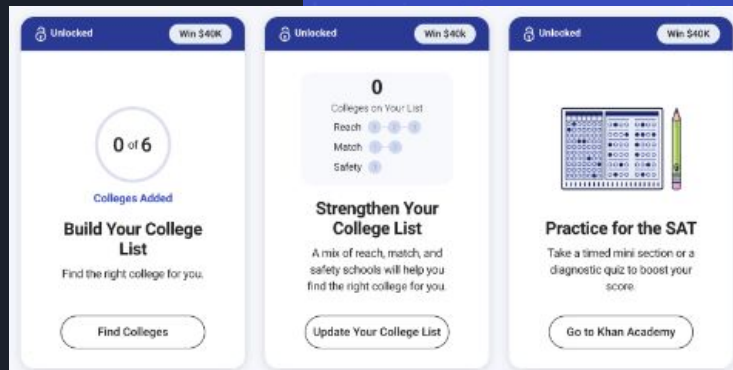
