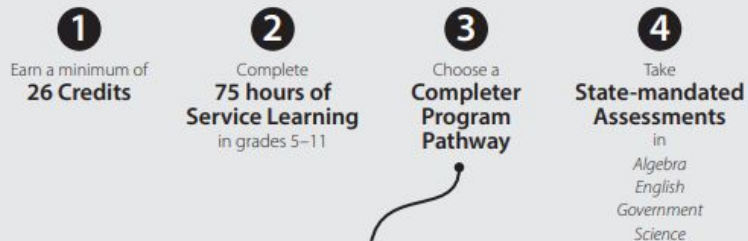

Earning Credit in High School

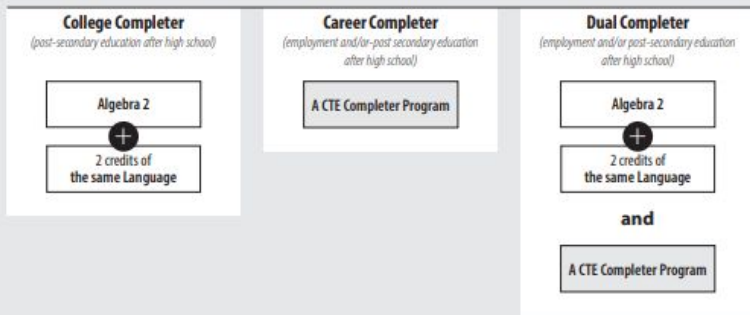
- Students earn credits toward both promotion & graduation
- Promotion is based on credit earned
- Core classes = .5 credit per semester
- Earn 4 credits per semester = 8 credits per year
- 26 credits needed to graduate
- Some students earn high school credit in middle school (by passing Algebra 1 and/or a World Language)

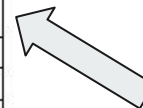


Procedures for Promotion

Promotion from one grade level to the next is based on the number and types of credits earned.

Through partnerships with the United States Army (Meade HS), Marines (Northeast HS), and Navy (Annapolis HS), instructors from all three branches prepare students in grades 9–12 for leadership roles while making them aware of their rights, responsibilities, and privileges as American citizens through rigorous instruction and hands-on activities.

Skills emphasized across all three branches:

- Leadership
- Citizenship
- Physical fitness
- Character

JROTC prepares students for life and they are not under any obligation to join the military. However, if they choose to further their interest in the military, satisfactory completion of the JROTC program can lead to advanced placement credit in the Senior ROTC program (college level) or advanced rank in any of the Armed Forces.

With the onset of the 2023-24 school year, AACPS is moving to a Magnet/Cluster structure for all three JROTC Leadership Programs (see below). As with all Magnets, clusters have been created based on the home high school of student participants and will be supported with transportation.

Similar to CAT Centers, the JROTC Magnets will remain partial-day programs with students engaging at the host site for periods 3 and 4 on an alternating day basis. This will allow them to remain members of the home school community while pursuing JROTC.

Early College Access Program (ECAP)



- Eligible AACPS students who submit an ECAP form approved by their school will **no longer be charged tuition and fees**
- Most classes taken for college credit only; A select number of classes available for dual credit (high school and college) if approved by principal
- Graduation requirements (e.g. English and Math) must be taken at BHS
- Seniors can opt for a partial schedule at BHS to take advantage of ECAP offerings
